GREEK STUDIES AT RUTGERS UNIVERSITY

Rutgers offers a wide spectrum of educational and research opportunities in Greek Studies. While being the home to a world renown Department of Classics, Rutgers also maintains worldclass Byzantine and Neohellenic academic programs that allow a comprehensive study of Greek history, language and culture over the span of forty centuries.

THE MODERN GREEK STUDIES PROGRAM at Rutgers is an exciting interdisciplinary effort that allows students to experience the language, literature, history, religion and culture of Greece through the centuries to the present. The Program offers three years of language instruction as well as advanced grammar and literature courses in Modern Greek. Many of the courses are offered in English, jointly with the Program in Comparative Literature, and the Departments of History, Religion, and Political Science. They include courses on History, on Greek Christianity, on the Genesis of Modern Greece, on Greek Society, on Modern Greek Literature, and many more. The Program currently offers a Minor Degree in Modern Greek and a total of 23 courses with over 100 students registering annually in them.

THE ELYTIS CHAIR FUND is a non-profit organization that was founded in 1989 for the purpose of promoting, encouraging, and financially supporting the study of Greek language, culture, and history, in its unique continuity across the centuries, at Rutgers The State University of NJ. MARIA FARANTOURI: A LIVING LEGEND

WE WELCOME the world-renowned Greek vocalist, Maria Farantouri, as she celebrates her fifty years of singing! A close collaborator of the great Greek composer Mikis Theodorakis, she has also performed and recorded works by composers ranging from George Gershwin to Lucio Dalla to Kurt Weill. Maria is a contralto singer with a deep, resonant voice, whose repertory extends from traditional and folk to jazz, classical, and avant-garde works.

She has been called the "Joan Baez of the Mediterranean" (Le Monde), "a gift from the gods of Olympus" (The Guardian), and "a people's Callas" (The Daily Telegraph). Last year she appeared at the MET with jazz saxophonist Charles Lloyd and his quartet, who introduced her as his "teacher for the last decade or so." Anyone who hears her songs can feel the "power and depth of humanity" that Charles Lloyd claims to have felt when he first heard her sing.

Maria Farantouri's voice has touched audiences and artists around the world and this performance is a rare opportunity to hear her at Rutgers The State University of New Jersey.
